2010-2011 ESA YEAR**

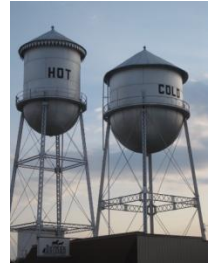

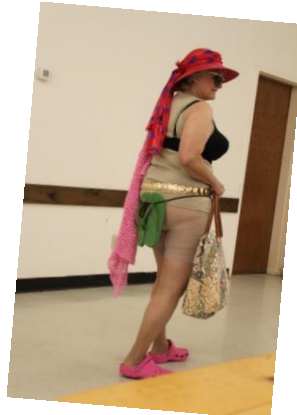
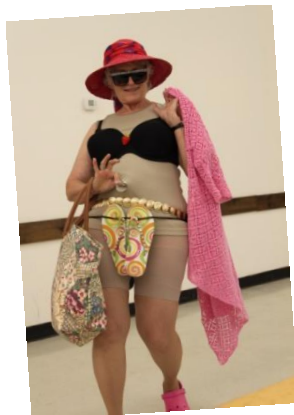

Like I said some people can just wear anything and look great! Hmmmmm- Mae West use to say "it's all in the hand baby" - it's called "well endowed" with class!



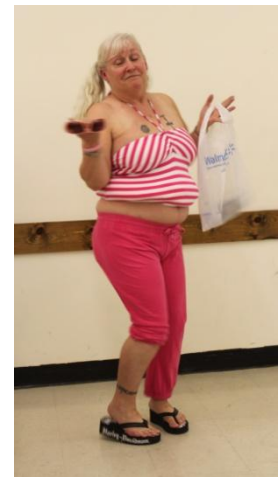
