

HOW TO MAKE A FABRIC WREATH
ESA EDUCATIONAL
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SUPPLIES:

- Yard Stick
- Pinking Shears
- Marking Pencil
- 3 pieces of coordinating fabric (1 yard each)
- Phillips screwdriver
- 14" straw wreath
- 1 wreath hanger

DIRECTIONS:

1. Turn first piece of fabric wrong side up and fold lengthwise.
2. Measure and mark fabric in 4" strips

4" STRIPS								
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(1 yard of fabric turned wrong side out)

3. Cut along each marking with pinking shears. Don't forget to pink the outer edges as well. You should now have 9 strips of fabric 4 inches wide.
4. Unfold strips and lay 3 - 4 thick; measure strips in to 4-inch squares and cut with pinking shears. You should now have approximately 100 4-inch squares.
5. Repeat steps 1-4 for the remaining pieces of coordinating fabric. You should now have a total of approximately 300 squares.
6. Using the Phillips screwdriver, select alternating fabric squares and poke the center of the fabric into the straw wreath. Place squares close together to avoid hole appearing in your finished product. Be sure to cover the front, inside, and outer edges. Leave the back side uncovered to your wreath will lay flat.
7. when completed, trim with your favorite ribbons, satin bows, paper-twist bows, beads, etc. Add the wreath hanger on the back, and display your handiwork!
